**FAMILY EASTER EVENT:** Mark your calendars for **Saturday**, **March 31**, (the day before Easter Sunday) and then invite a friend to join you on a thought provoking and meaningful Easter journey. Kids and their families and friends will travel through five stations uniquely designed to encourage thinking and get families talking about the final events of Jesus life here on earth. They will experience the excitement surrounding Jesus' arrival in Jerusalem, the significance of the Last Supper, the darkness at Gethsemane, the sacrifice Jesus made on the cross, and the joy of His resurrection. At about 7:15, we will proceed to the sanctuary for a Tenebrae service – a service of gathering darkness – during which we will reflect on the gospel accounts of Christ's arrest and crucifixion. This is a very meaningful service, which helps us reflect on Jesus Christ's sacrifice for us.

**GOOD FRIDAY SERVICES** Pastors from a number of area churches will lead a Stations of the Cross service at Sacred Heart Catholic Church at 11 AM on Good Friday, March 30. Then, following the service (approx. 11:45), all who wish to follow the cross through Lewistown will meet outside Sacred Heart for a prayer walk through our community. You are welcome to take part in either or both services.

**EASTER SUNRISE:** We will meet at Mount Rock Cemetery at 7:30 on Easter morning for an early service at which we will reflect on the wonder of the women who came to Jesus' tomb to find it empty, and the joy of the realization that Christ is risen!

## **TODAY'S SCRIPTURE**

Psalm 139:1-18, 23-24

<sup>1</sup> You have searched me, LORD, and you know me. <sup>2</sup> You know when I sit and when I rise; you perceive my thoughts from afar. <sup>3</sup> You discern my going out and my lying down; you are familiar with all my ways. <sup>4</sup> Before a word is on my tongue you, LORD, know it completely. 5 You hem me in behind and before, and you lay your hand upon me. 6 Such knowledge is too wonderful for me, too lofty for me to attain. 7 Where can I go from your Spirit? Where can I flee from your presence? 8 If I go up to the heavens, you are there; if I make my bed in the depths, you are there. <sup>9</sup> If I rise on the wings of the dawn, if I settle on the far side of the sea, 10 even there your hand will quide me, your right hand will hold me fast. 11 If I say, "Surely the darkness will hide me and the light become night around me," 12 even the darkness will not be dark to you; the night will shine like the day, for darkness is as light to you. 13 For you created my inmost being; you knit me together in my mother's womb. 14 I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made; your works are wonderful; I know that full well. 15 My frame was not hidden from you when I was made in the secret place, when I was woven together in the depths of the earth. 16 Your eyes saw my unformed body; all the days ordained for me were written in your book before one of them came to be. 17 How precious to me are vour thoughts, God! How vast is the sum of them! 18 Were I to count them, they would outnumber the grains of sand—when I awake, I am still with you.
