Following the communion service there will be pizza for all downstairs in the Baraca room.

MAUNDY THURSDAY OBSERVANCE: This Thursday, March 29, join us in the Baraca Room at 6:30 PM for a light meal followed by the Lord's Supper. At about 7:15, we will proceed to the sanctuary for a Tenebrae service – a service of gathering darkness – during which we will reflect on the gospel accounts of Christ's arrest and crucifixion. This is a very meaningful service, which helps us reflect on Jesus Christ's sacrifice for us.

GOOD FRIDAY SERVICES: Pastors from a number of area churches will lead a Stations of the Cross service at Sacred Heart Catholic Church at 11 AM on Good Friday, March 30. Then, following the service (approx. 11:45), all who wish to follow the cross through Lewistown will meet outside Sacred Heart for a prayer walk through our community. You are welcome to take part in either or both services.
