SMALL GROUP MINISTRY

YOUTH DOWN AND OUT BOUT, May 11, 12 at Kish Park: The Youth of our church, McVeytown Presbyterian and 1st United Methodist Church will be having an overnight designed to open our eyes and our hearts to the reality of homelessness and hunger in Mifflin County. To help accomplish this, youth and adult leaders will spend the night in and around the Brown Pavilion of Kish Park, sleeping in make-shift tents and cardboard boxes. We will experience a soup kitchen, simulate what it might be like to find food to eat and hear from representatives from The Shelter Services. Part of Saturday afternoon will be spent in service projects in the park, followed by supper at Highland Park Presbyterian Church. Youth will be collecting hygiene products, cleaning products and monetary donations for the Shelter Services in Lewistown.

Youth, be sure to pick up a permission form and additional information sheet from Ginny, Susan or Miranda. Cost for the event (to cover T-shirt expenses) is \$10.

TODAY'S SCRIPTURE

1 John 2:3-14

^{2:3} We know that we have come to know him if we keep his commands. ⁴ Whoever says, "I know him," but does not do what he commands is a liar, and the truth is not in that person. ⁵ But if anyone obeys his word, love for God is truly made complete in them.
