NEW POSITION AT LEWISTOWN PRESBYTERIAN: In order to strengthen our educational programming and create a closer relationship between the church and our preschool, the session has formed a new position of director of all educational programming at Lewistown Presbyterian Church and Lewistown Presbyterian Preschool. This position has been offered to and accepted by Ginny Westover. In this role, Ginny will continue to coordinate Sunday School, Bible School, Youth Group, and Adult Educational and Small Group offerings, but she will take on the additional role of Lewistown Presbyterian Preschool Director. In this role, she will work with the Preschool Committee to develop curriculum for our Nursery School and Preschool, serve as lead teacher in the Preschool program and supervisor of the entire nursery school preschool program. This is part of an ongoing effort to build the relationship between the church and the school, and it will serve our goal of providing not only excellent preparation for kindergarten, but also provide our students with Biblical teaching to give them and their families the opportunity to know and follow Jesus Christ. Your session is very excited by the possibilities afforded by this decision. Because of the staffing changes necessitated by this new position, we were unable to renew Sherri Powell's contract for the 2018-2019 school year. We are grateful for her many years of service to our school.

TODAY'S SCRIPTURE

Exodus 20:8-11

⁸Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy. ⁹Six days you shall labor and do all your work, ¹⁰but the seventh day is a sabbath to the LORD your God. On it you shall not do any work, neither you, nor your son or daughter, nor your male or female servant, nor your animals, nor any foreigner residing in your towns. ¹¹For in six days the LORD made the heavens and the earth, the sea, and all that is in them, but he rested on the seventh day. Therefore the LORD blessed the Sabbath day and made it holy.

Mark 2:23-3:6

²³One Sabbath Jesus was going through the grainfields, and as his disciples walked along, they began to pick some heads of grain. ²⁴The Pharisees said to him, "Look, why are they doing what is unlawful on the Sabbath?"

²⁵He answered, "Have you never read what David did when he and his companions were hungry and in need? ²⁶In the days of Abiathar the high priest, he entered the house of God and ate the consecrated bread, which is lawful only for priests to eat. And he also gave some to his companions."

²⁷Then he said to them, "The Sabbath was made for man, not man for the Sabbath. ²⁸So the Son of Man is Lord even of the Sabbath."

^{3:1}Another time Jesus went into the synagogue, and a man with a shriveled hand was there. ²Some of them were looking for a reason to accuse Jesus, so they watched him closely to see if he would heal him on the Sabbath. ³Jesus said to the man with the shriveled hand, "Stand up in front of everyone."

⁴Then Jesus asked them, "Which is lawful on the Sabbath: to do good or to do evil, to save life or to kill?" But they remained silent.

⁵He looked around at them in anger and, deeply distressed at their stubborn hearts, said to the man, "Stretch out your hand." He stretched it out, and his hand was completely restored. ⁶Then the Pharisees went out and began to plot with the Herodians how they might kill Jesus.
