# THE BUS DRIVER

The bus sits empty waiting for passengers to board. As I climb the steps, I decide I'd like to be in the driver's seat. While other passengers file onto the bus and wait patiently for the driver to arrive, I climb behind the wheel. Soon the real driver arrives and says softly, "Child, you cannot drive this bus. You do not know where you are going."

"But I think I do," I protest. "I've identified my destination and planned my route carefully. I know how to get there myself."

"I'm sorry," the driver says. "You must move to another seat and allow me to drive the bus."

I acquiesce, and ask "Where shall I sit? Shall I sit in the back?"

"No," he replies. "If you sit in the back you will become distracted by others who only wish to have fun without paying attention to the journey."

"The middle?" I ask. "The middle may be better, but it will not allow you to have the best view along the way. You may not see your stop coming up until it is too late," he answers.

"Okay, so where shall I sit?" I ask impatiently. "Sit in the front seat, to my right. From there, you will be able to see both me and the road ahead very clearly. You will hear me when I tell you it is your destination, and I will hear you if you feel scared or worried along the way. But do not attempt to direct me to stop at your whim, and you must trust me when I tell you that you have arrived where you are



supposed to be. Even if it looks unfamiliar to you, and you want to go a different direction, you must go where I say and go willingly. Do these things, and I promise you will be safe and secure in my care no matter where you are."

I'm sure it became evident in the beginning of the story that the driver of the bus is Jesus. And it's a metaphor that has surely been used many times before. However, there has never been a time in my life when I felt so compelled to put the comparison into these precise words. I have recently begun a rather terrifying journey of my own—battling cancer. That was absolutely NOT along my planned route in life! There is no way I would have pulled the cord to get off at that stop, ever! But here I am, four weeks into treatment, losing some things (muscle strength, hair, the ability to make plans I won't have to cancel). I am, however, gaining so much more.

I have gained a new appreciation for humanity because of so many people who have stepped up to love, support, and pray for me. I have gained the ability to say, "I am not afraid", and mean it because I know my Savior is protecting me. I have gained the understanding that I do not control my circumstances; I cannot create them the way I thought I could, and I cannot ask to be delivered of them simply because it is an inconvenient or objectionable situation to me. Instead, I must sit in the front of the bus, beside my Lord, and wait until He tells me where he is taking me and what He wishes for me to do when I get there.

## CODE OF CONDUCT FOR FORMER PASTORS

---

Huntingdon Presbytery has formulated the following rules concerning departing pastors in order to facilitate a smooth pastoral transition for member churches.

### **The departing pastor will:**

- Not discuss pastoral concerns with parishioners
- Not discuss current church leadership but guide parishioners to discuss concerns with current leadership.
- Defer to the present pastor or moderator when asked to officiate a baptism, wedding, funeral or service of worship.
- Share these guidelines with the congregation and session prior to leaving
- Acknowledge receipt of the above policy and agree to abide by its provisions.

### **The session will:**

- Provide pastoral care for the members of the congregation. They will refer members with need of pastoral services to the current pastor and/or moderator.
- If the session receives information that a former pastor has been called by a parishioner about a pastoral concern, the ruling elders of the session will explain that the former pastor can no longer be involved and that the parishioner should contact the current moderator or pastor.
- Direct members not to discuss concerns about current leadership with the former pastor.
- Acknowledge receipt of the above policy and agree to abide by its provisions.
