OUR SISTER, HELEN

Every night in our log house here in Treaster Valley we sleep under a hand pieced and quilted floral quilt which was a gift from our sister, Helen. She made this quilt before she was married

early in the 50's and presented it to us only recently. The warmth of this quilt warms us every night and is a constant reminder of our sister who died on September 26 of this year at the age of 97 years. The physical comfort which we enjoy is far surpassed by the feelings we have by remembering her and her life.

Helen was the second born of the seven Zorn sibling, consisting of three girls and four boys. Her older sister, Cora "Dolly" and she started elementary school together, so that neither girl would have to walk the nearly one mile path to the first grade alone. The two girls shared companionship with each other through elementary and high school. Differences in their interests and activities appeared at a very early age. Dolly seemed to gravitate toward outdoor activities, such as gardening, animals and flowers. Helen chose to find her interests in sewing, canning and cooking. Electricity did not come to our home for another ten years; indoor plumbing had to wait another twenty years beyond that. Both girls proudly wore their 4-H club dyed feed sack clothing.

Helen learned to play a piano and occasionally substituted in our church. Helen's commercial high school course prepared her for a business college degree and employment in several banks and other businesses. She found employment at

a diary plant office. There she met and married her husband, James Edward. They became parents of two boys, Jimmy and Stephen.

Helen was not unaccustomed to sorrow and grief when Ed died. She was left alone while their sons were still young. Two brothers-in-law were lost to death. One, lost in World War II, was never found.

She (and we) lived through the depression years. Despite rationing and other scarcities, she and her friends made literally bushels of cookies to send to servicemen, near and far. Personally I will always remember her help to me. She bought my high school suit and class ring and gave much help and encouragement through my college years.

In recent years, upon the death of Carol's two sisters, Helen stepped in with words and deeds of kindness and sympathy, which made Carol's walk alone a little easier.

When we last visited Helen in a hospital, as we were leaving, she took Carol's hand and pulled her a little closer and whispered, "Thank you for being my sister." Carol responded with the same words. Helen's last words to her son were, "Tell Bob I'm still a Presbyterian."

I have consistently used the pronoun "our" because Helen has been a sister to every one of us. Each and everyone of us are blessed by sister and brothers who hold important places in our lives. We are blessed by their lives and witness.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

Christmas has been called the most anticipated day of the year. Stores go to great lengths to prepare for the big day. (We are all aware of how early Christmas décor shows up on the shelves...) Churches plan for special services well in advance. Here at LPC, various committees have been tossing ideas and dates around for weeks. We all know how quickly the calendar fills.

The annual question each of us must ask is, "How will I prepare for Christmas?" Before we can prepare we need to have a picture in our minds of what we want the holidays to be like; or better yet, perhaps, what **we** want to be like during the holidays. I doubt that anyone would choose "stressed, exhausted and empty" yet that is too often exactly what results. If the picture we would like is closer to "peaceful, rested, and spiritually full" we must plan the steps to make it happen. (and then, of course, work the plan.)

As believers in Christ, we know that Christmas is about Jesus, but how can we keep Him the focus of our preparations instead of just an afterthought? We keep Jesus front and center by doing what the scriptures call us to do: "remember." This command is repeated 148 times throughout the Old and New Testaments. Perhaps because we are so prone to forget? I was challenged recently by these thoughts from Asheritah Ciuciu: "We all suffer from soul amnesia, forgetting who God is and what He has done for us from one day to the next. Like you, I must remind myself each year who Jesus is and why His birth is so miraculous—not because my mind doesn't know, but because my heart ceases to be amazed. As the old saying goes, "Familiarity breeds contempt, and sadly, my own heart loses that sense of wonder." Ms. Ciuciu is not alone. Each of us needs the Spirit of God to help us re-member; to put together again the incredible story of God coming in flesh to live with us. Our part is to create the time and space



to do just that. The season of Advent is the perfect time.

To create space, some ruthless paring is required. Not necessarily a lot. Just a deliberate, unapologetic cutting back. What that means can only be answered individually. Maybe it means cutting back on decorating. Two strings of lights instead of twenty two. Maybe cutting back on entertaining or the number of holiday

parties/programs you agree to attend will create time and space for pausing and

remembering. For others it might be in the area of shopping or staying up late or baking where some ruthless paring is needed in order to free up a couple hours to spend with Jesus.

Whatever it is, start small. Change happens one step at a time. Baby steps are indeed steps. Know that they are noticed and will be rewarded. James 4:8 tells us, "Draw near to God and He will draw near to you." Use that criteria to determine holiday happenings. Ask, "Will this activity draw me closer to God or move me farther away from Him?" Ask the same question of your family.

As you give thanks for your many blessings, you will know that other families are benefiting from your generous contribution of time and talent.

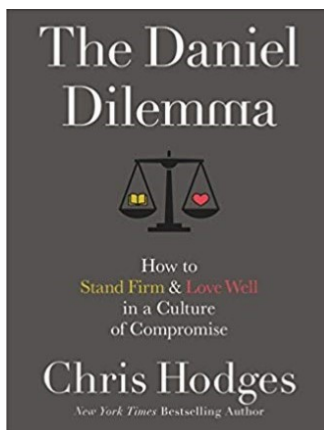

OPPORTUNITIES FOR SPIRITUAL GROWTH

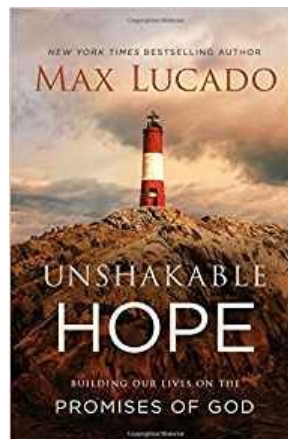
SMALL GROUP MINISTRY
