Happy June to you all! In case you have lost track of the days, weeks or months during COVID-19, it is officially June. Although it is a very different start to June than we are accustomed to having.


Normally, we would be attending graduation parties, checking out a local festival, or attending an

Community Vacation Bible School

We are moving full steam ahead with plans for "Bible School in a Bag"; an online guided Vacation Bible School using Group Publishing, Rocky Railway. The Christian Ed Committee is excited about



this unique opportunity to partner with our community's churches to spread the good news of Jesus' love to the children in our neighborhoods! Joining Lewistown Presbyterian in this venture is First United Methodist, Grace United Methodist and Sacred Heart. We will be using a combination of Rocky Railway videos and our own recordings posted online as well as off-line, along with a week's worth of VBS fun in a bag delivered to children's homes. Each "Bible School in a Bag" will contain instructions to participate online, a Bible adventure book with all the Bible stories, materials to make each day's craft, coloring pages, Bible buddy characters, a pre-packaged snack, and more!

Rocky Railway will take place Monday, June 29 – Friday, July 3.


step with the Spirit of God, stay unified and communicate clearly to the children and with each other. Please pray for technology to work and run smoothly.

Help Deliver Bags! (details are in the works for this; it may entail driving to homes and dropping off bags or helping with a drive-by pick-up).

Purchase Pre-packaged, Individualized Snacks. We need snacks for 200 kid's times 5 days! That's 1000 individual, pre-packaged snacks! Donations of individual, store-manufacturer's wrapped Rice Krispy treats, pretzels, crackers, gummies, cookies, etc. are welcomed and can be dropped off at the church by **June 19**.

Sponsor a VBS child and bag. Sponsor a "Bible School in a Bag" for \$10 per bag. Sponsors will receive the first name of a child so that you can pray for that child through VBS and the summer. Contact the church office for more information.

One of the most exciting positives that the Pandemic has brought about, in my opinion, is a coming together of followers of Jesus Christ who are focused on the common goal of bringing honor to him through demonstrating his love.
