## Crown Him with Many Crowns 268



This text is so familiar that it is easy to miss all its paradox, mystery, suffering, and beauty; it rewards careful reading and meditation outside corporate worship. The tune's composer, chapel organist at Windsor Castle, had much experience in creating a royal sound.

CREATION AND PROVIDENCE



In the course of many revisions, the original eucharistic emphasis of this text has shifted to a hymn of thanksgiving for a wide range of human experience, with a Christological summation. It is set here to the tune that is customary in North America, though not elsewhere.

This well-known melody was created to provide a choral setting for J. C. F. von Schiller's poem, "An die Freude" (To Joy), as the final movement of the composer's *Ninth Symphony*. The author, a prominent Presbyterian pastor and author, wrote the words with this tune in mind.

HYMN TO JOY 87.87.D

CREATION AND PROVIDENCE



\*Or "Great is thy faithfulness, O God, Creator."

Written as a meditation on Lamentations 3:22-23, this text is one of the few hymns among the 1200 poems by this Methodist writer and pastor that has gained much currency. The tune that appears here was composed especially for these works, and the pairing has proved enduring. Hello friends,

The Session met Thursday for their stated monthly meeting. We began our meeting with a devotion and praying for the church and our leadership. We received reports from a variety of committees, from our Deacons, and from the work of the Presbytery, reminding us that the church is alive and well.

We also talked about the information we are receiving about the rise in COVID-19 cases in Mifflin County and beyond. We acknowledged the move of Mifflin County School District to full remote learning. The Session agreed that the information they are reading cannot be ignored in our community, state and nation, and it can't be ignored within our church walls.

It was a tough decision, but I will emphasize that the Elders made it with prayerful hearts and a desire to do what is best for our church family and community. Effective immediately, the Session voted unanimously to make these decisions:

1. Beginning Nov. 22, all worship will be provided on-line through Zoom and YouTube. In-person worship will be suspended through the end of December. Christmas Eve worship will be provided online, too.

2. Lewistown Preschool will go to remote learning. The preschool teachers will work with the Preschool Committee to determine if reopening is possible, based on decisions made by Mifflin County School District (MCSD). If MCSD reopens, even if the church remains closed, the Preschool Committee will discern if reopening the Lewistown Preschool is possible and appropriate.

3. All inside church groups and outside groups will be asked to refrain from using church space through the end of December.

4. Staff and church members are encouraged to limit their time inside the church building. Masks are required, as well as, social distancing.

I know this is terribly hard to embrace, especially during a time of year in which the beauty of Advent and Christmas radiates inside our sanctuary. It's not what we want, but Session believes it is what we must do. I think about how dramatically life changed for Mary and Joseph and for the shepherds and the Magi. They were pulled into the "unknown," just like we feel we are some days because of COVID-19. And yet, the "unknown" brought them to the manger and God revealed to them the purpose of their wandering: The birth of Jesus Christ!

Let us journey together this Advent season with a spirit of trust in God Almighty. May we embrace the changes with grateful hearts in knowing that we do not journey alone. God is for us.

The Spirit intercedes on our behalf. Jesus will be born. And we will help each other in all the ways we can. The Church is STILL alive!
